

## Catch- up Premium

### 1. How much funding did we receive this year?

This year we have received £27,000 Catch Up Premium. The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support Year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading and maths at the end of Key Stage 2

### How do we intend to spend this year's allocation?

We have allocated the funding to support our pupils in the following ways:

### How last year's allocation made a difference to the outcomes of the pupils?

To measure the impact of the additional funding received, all ATT academies use GL Assessments to benchmark, measure and analyse the progress made by each pupil. GL Assessments provide nationally recognised Standardised Age Scores which can be used to robustly analyse if progress has been made. Standardised Age Scores show that a pupil is working at age related expectation if the score is 100+ at end of KS2 or equivalent.

#### English

In September 2016, 89 out of 206 pupils arrived at our academy who were not yet secondary ready in English. At the end of the year, 74 of those pupils were working at age related expectation.

## Maths

In September 2016, 5 out of 206 pupils arrived at our academy who were not yet secondary ready in Mathematics. At the end of the year, 53 of those pupils were working at age related expectation.

By the end of the academic year, there were now only 27 students in English and 34 students in Maths who were identified as not working at level 4, based on the summer term GL assessments.
