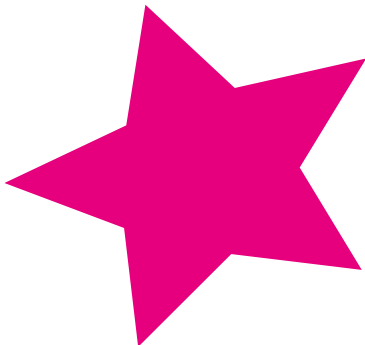

Netball

Cross Country

Ben and James Peck represented the academy in the English Schools National Cross Country Championship Finals in Leeds on Saturday 16th March 2019. They competed alongside each other in the Junior Boys (Years 8 & 9 combined) race with James achieving seventh place and Ben coming in third. Both boys are now in the England squad and are competing in the Internationals in Dublin on Saturday 23rd March 2019!

Earlier this year Ben, competing in the colours of Thetford running club, was crowned English Champion in the U13 age group. This enabled him to compete in another race against the best runners from Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales. He again came out on top and is now ranked as the number 1 runner in the whole of the UK in his age group!



Sporting Successes

Football

On Tuesday 5th March 2019 the Under 18 football team made the long journey to Bungay High School to compete against their Sixth Form Football Academy side in the Suffolk Cup Quarter Finals.

Fine solo efforts from Callum Horn and Jake Alecock in the first half saw us go in to the break with a 2-1 advantage. A late equaliser for Bungay took the game to extra time, and with no further goals scored, penalties were required to separate the teams and determine who would progress to the semi-finals.

After 5 penalties apiece, the scores were locked at 4-4! Freddy Gallagher went on to make two wonderful saves, allowing super-sub Harry Lowman to step up and become the Mildenhall hero awarding MCA a win of 6-5 on penalties.

U16 Girls

The U16 girls football team have qualified for the quarter finals of the Suffolk Cup, following a 3-2 victory against King Edward VI School. The girls played incredibly well with plenty of free-flowing football on show courtesy of Rebecca Towler, Annalise Brown and Katie Hayes in the midfield. Early into the second half MCA's Jemima Kent scored and a handball from the opposition's centre back inside the penalty area gifted MCA a penalty. Katie Hayes stepped up confidently and slotted the ball home.

The game looked done and dusted, but to King Edward VI School's credit, they bounced straight back and scored immediately from the restart. Fortunately, a second goal from Jemima Kent eased the nerves. King Edward VI School netted once more in the last few seconds of the game but this was no more than a consolation. The girls will meet County Upper in the next round.

Ryan Wilson netted the pick of the Mildenhall goals, expertly connecting with an acrobatic effort from an Olly Hollands corner. Bebras Successes

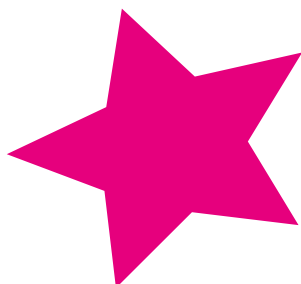
Talented Year 7 student Chloe Palmer was invited to the Department of Computer Science at the University of Oxford on Sunday 17 February as a finalist in a UK-wide competition – The UK Bebras Computational Thinking Challenge.

Reaching the final of the Juniors age group is an impressive achievement, as 59,804 students entered the first round for the age group (10–12). Chloe was among the top 60 highest achieving students invited to the final round in her age group, and was presented with her finalist’s certificate at a prize-giving ceremony at Hertford College.

The UK Bebras Computational Thinking Challenge, supported by Google, is designed to get students excited about computing and computational thinking. It is a problem-solving contest with questions inspired by topics in computer science. In the first round, held in their own schools, students have to try and solve as many problems as possible in the allotted time. There are six age categories. The highest scoring students from the four oldest age groups (Elite, Seniors, Intermediate, and Juniors) were then invited to the Department of Computer Science at Oxford for the finals over two weekends in February.

“During the half term holiday, I went to Oxford University to participate in the next round of the Bebras challenge. While I was there, I attended some interesting presentations, each of which taught me something new, as well as completing the actual Bebras challenge. The challenge was quite difficult but was still fun to complete. This has been a great experience for me.”
