

Uniform Procedure

This procedure is reviewed every three years. It can be reviewed sooner if amendments to legislation or educational practice necessitate a change.





It is a valuable part of a child's education to learn to present him or herself publicly in a neat and appropriate manner. This is especially so in a formal environment such as the academy or place of work.

The high standards of appearance we expect at Mildenhall College Academy have a positive impact upon the standing of our academy within the wider community. Academy Uniform must be worn correctly at all times. All clothing should be clean, smart and marked with the student's name.

Detailed below is the student uniform policy.

To be worn at all times:

- MCA Blazer
- MCA Tie
- MCA Skirt/ Black Tailored Trousers
- Black Socks or Tights
- Black Shoes (Low heeled and plain black) with no markings

PE Kit

- House Polo Shirt
- MCA Sweatshirt
- Black Shorts/ Skort/ Tracksuit Bottoms/ Sports Leggings
- Black football socks
- Change of footwear
- Shin Pads, Gum Shield & Football Boots (All optional)

Hair

- Colour should be natural and no extremes colours
- Styles should not be extreme, no shaven heads

Jewellery

- One small stud per ear
- One watch
- No bangles or bracelets or necklaces
- No facial piercings

If you unsure on an item of uniform please email your child's tutor who will be happy to support you and ensure your child has access to the correct uniform.

Incorrect Uniform

If a student is in incorrect uniform they will be seen by a member of the pastoral team and asked to change into the correct uniform. Clean, spare uniform is kept in the House Office. If it is possible then parents/carers will be contacted to bring in the correct uniform.

Banned items such as bangles, piercings etc. will be confiscated and kept securely until the end of the day or if not the first occasion, until parents/carers can collect the item.

Refusal to correct uniform misdemeanours will result in the student working in an alternative area during lessons and at break and lunch.
