## Mildenhall Hub Works

Please see the copy of an email we have received from Mildenhall Hub:

I am contacting all Mildenhall Hub Partners and Tenants to make you aware that on Monday 6 October, West Suffolk Council have arranged for Lark Technology and Velux UK to replace the broken roof light in the Atrium. This will involve sectioning off the area of works in the centre of the Atrium, preventing visitors and staff from accessing the working site. This will mean when entering the building through the main entrances you will be able to access the







lift and stairs to the offices, family centre, health centre, library, academy, advice centre, meeting rooms and public toilets only. To access the leisure centre, activity room and café, visitors and staff will need to use the fire escape door located in the right-hand corner of the plaza near the new picnic tables as you face the building. There will be some preparation works on Friday 3 October 2025 when a shelving unit is removed from the library area, but we will endeavour to keep disruption to a minimum.

Directional signage will be put out on the day and all going well, the works should be completed by the end of the day.

The fire evacuation procedure will remain the same for all areas except the library area, where West Suffolk Council will put in temporary arrangements with the library while works are carried out.



#### First Aid

Students are expected to let their teachers know if they feel unwell during a lesson. The teacher will assess whether it is necessary to call First Aid to visit the classroom.

Alternatively, students can visit the medical room during their break or lunchtimes. If students go to the medical room at the end of break or lunchtime, they will be asked to go to their next lesson to register and let the teacher know they feel unwell. Our First Aid staff will then contact parents/carers where necessary.







We will remind students to make a member of staff aware if they feel unwell rather than contacting home themselves. This is for a number of reasons:

- We need to know if a child feels unwell to ensure they get the prompt attention needed.
- We can discuss whether there is another issue with the student to support them.
- Use of mobile phones whilst in the Academy is not permitted.

The routines introduced last year have ensured that we can quickly account for the presence of students in the Academy. This is because class teachers are involved in the medical request process. Thank you for your ongoing support.
