##### Parent Webinars on County Lines and Criminal Exploitation (Ivison Trust)

The Ivison Trust (formerly Pace) is a national charity working to keep children safe from exploitation by supporting parents, disrupting exploiters, and working in partnership with police and family services. Their work is grounded in a trauma-informed, family-centred approach.



During March 2026, the Ivison Trust is delivering a series of live webinars for parents and carers focused on county lines and criminal exploitation. The sessions help parents understand how exploitation happens, how children are groomed, what warning signs to look out for, and where to access advice and support. Each webinar includes local context, time for questions, and input from a parent with lived experience.

#### **Uniform Expectations**

I would like to thank parents and carers who have supported our uniform policy and the recent updates. I thought that it would be useful to clarify our expectations and to provide some further guidance about some of the items and recent adaptations. The updated policy will replace all others on our website and provides detail on items of clothing which have become more of a common issue:

- Flared leggings with a stretchy thin material that are too revealing and not appropriate for a professional setting.
- Jumpers and jumpers that are not similar to our MCA branded V-neck jumper.
- Two stud earrings in each ear as a maximum and one nose stud.
- No visible jewellery apart from a watch.

Please re-read the policy and expectations if you have any concerns or questions. We need to be consistent in ensuring that all students have the correct uniform. Like nearly all schools in the country and many organisations with a dress code- we need to ensure that we have a fair and objective approach. Addressing uniform expectations can feel like a negative interaction but it is necessary that we do so.





Miss Powell has put together a document with links to retailers that provide non-branded items that align with our policy. 'Non-MCA branded' items are an important affordable part of our uniform. The number of 'MCA branded' has been recently reviewed and reduced with the rationale to lower uniform costs.

We have spare uniform supplies available in the House Support Hub if there is an accident or short-term issue that we can help with. Ties are available to borrow from Student Reception.

We have a reasonable expectation that all missing or incorrect uniform issues are resolved before Period 1 so that we can focus on learning activities for the remainder of the day. A Social Detention will be issued to students who have not resolved an issue and if there are no extenuating circumstances that we are aware of. We will also issue a detention to students who forget or have a second uniform issue in the same week. It is important that parents/carers let us know if a longer-term loan of a uniform item is required. We will always try to help and resolve issues if there has been an issue at home. *Thankyou, Mr Oxley*
